

At a reconvened meeting of the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors held on Monday, May 27, 1991 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board of Supervisors meeting room of the County Administration Building, 143 Third Street, N. W. in the Town of Pulaski, the following members were present: Jerry D. White, Vice-Chairman; Bruce L. Fariss; Joseph L. Sheffey; and V. E. Vaughn. Also present were the County Attorney, Director of Management Services, and the County Administrator.

Chairman Mason Vaughan, Sr. was absent.

Vice-Chairman White presided over the meeting in Chairman Vaughan's absence.

#### 1. Public Hearing FY 92 Budget

The County Administrator provided those in attendance with a copy of the budget advertisement, advised that the budget could be adopted seven days after completion of the hearing, which adoption is scheduled for June 3, 1991, and offered to address any questions regarding the budget proposal and preparation.

Comments on the budget were made by Mr. Colbern Linkous.

Mr. Randy Miles representing the Fairlawn Volunteer Fire Department requested authorization to develop specifications and seek bids for the fire engine pumper that is the next priority vehicle purchase on the county capital improvements plan for fire departments, but which has not been included in the current budget proposal. Mr. Miles estimated three to six months to complete the bidding process and a similar period to have delivery of the vehicle.

RE: Fairlawn Volunteer Fire Department Pumper Purchase Timing

It was moved by Dr. Fariss, seconded by Mr. Sheffey and carried, that the County Administrator be instructed to investigate timing for procurement of the proposed Fairlawn Volunteer Fire Department pumper, to determine whether procurement could begin now that would result in delivery of the vehicle and payment after July 1, 1992, to delay payment to the FY 93 fiscal year.

Not present: Mr. Vaughan.

Mr. Edward Campbell, representing the Pulaski County Lifesaving Crew, requested funding of a \$65,000 light duty crash truck, which is the next scheduled rescue squad
