

At the reconvened regular May meeting of the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors held on Monday, June 7, 1993 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board of Supervisors meeting room at the County Administration Building, 143 Third Street, N. W. in the Town of Pulaski, Virginia, the following members were present: Jerry D. White, Chairman; Joseph L. Sheffey, Vice-Chairman; Dr. Bruce L. Fariss; and Ira S. "Pete" Crawford and Mason A. Vaughan, Sr. Also present were County Attorney Thomas J. McCarthy, Jr., Community Relations Coordinator Terri J. Gregory, and County Administrator Joseph N. Morgan.

#### 1. Joint Meeting with Pulaski/Dublin/Pulaski County (PDPC) Recreation Commission

Chairman White welcomed members of the PDPC. Those PDPC members in attendance were: Jeff Berkley; Dave Hart; Jeff Williams; Kenneth Harrell; Eddie Hale; Bill Boardwine; Al Carden; and Bruce Fariss. Absent were: Jack Bruce; Bunchy Compton; Tom Combiths; and Vernon Crouch. He also welcomed Youth Sports Coordinator John Meyers, Dublin Vice-Mayor David Farmer, Dublin Town Manager Gary Elander, and other members of the public in attendance.

The Chairman thanked members of the recreation commissioners for providing improved youth sports opportunities for county youth. He entertained comments from the recreation commission on the efforts need for continued improvement of youth sports recreation.

Mr. Jeff Berkley noted a lack of input by recreation commission in the formation of joint agreements between the towns and the county for recreation services. He noted other concerns regarding disparity between programs provided by the Town of Pulaski and the County, notably compensation of officials. He suggested seven members be the maximum on the PDPC and that members of the staff be excluded from participating.

Mr. Hart suggested a more moderate reorganization. He suggested a more clear personnel administration for the youth sports coordinator, possibly providing professional supervision rather than volunteer supervision under the chairman of the PDPC.

Mr. Carden noted that each recreation department needs to maintain its identity and still participate in a county-wide program.

Mr. Boardwine, in his capacity as chairman of the PCPC, gave a status report the extent of youth sports opportunities available. He noted that the goal of providing youth sports opportunities is being largely accomplished. He stated that 1,533 children have participated in the past year in various sports, not counting those programs provided to children through the joint efforts of the PDPC and the Town of Pulaski.

Chairman White called the overall program effective. He noted that "together we can do more than we can do separately." He also noted the PDPC has created a vehicle for a county-wide recreation park facility to be developed in the future. He thanked all of those serving on the PDPC, as well as the staff members involved in the county-wide program. He suggested a more frequent meeting and status report to the Board of Supervisors, at least annually.

Chairman White invited members of the audience to make comments. Mr. Bill Crisby and Ms. Si Rasnake addressed the Board regarding youth sports recreation and the relationship between the county and Dublin Recreation Incorporated as to current and past leaders.

#### 2. Pulaski Community Hospital - Oncology Center

Supervisor Sheffey, as an accommodation to Supervisor Vaughan due to his absence from the June 24 meeting, suggested reconsideration of the motion to

endorse the Pulaski Community Hospital proposed Oncology Center.

A general discussion was held regarding the proposed center.

It was moved by Supervisor Sheffey, seconded by Supervisor Crawford and carried on the following roll call vote that the following motion endorsing the Pulaski Community Hospital's proposed Oncology Center be reconsidered and adopted:

That the Board of Supervisors indicated unanimous support for the proposed Pulaski Community Hospital Oncology Center.

Voting yes: Mr. Crawford, Mr. White, Mr. Vaughan.

Voting no: Dr. Fariss, Mr. Sheffey.
