- b. Claytor Lake Sewer Line Extension Change Order #7 – 97-12-2 – Ratification is requested for the extension of a water line to the proposed truck stop property. Thirty-five thousand five hundred three dollars (\$35,503) will be paid by the truck stop developer. The balance of the \$54,763.10 will be requested from other future users.
 - c. Route 660 Water Line Project Change Order #4 - 97-12-3 – Ratification of the ***enclosed*** change order totaling \$46,033.00 is requested. The change order extends water to the Walters Trailer Park, which has been approved by the Public Service Authority. The extension will add customers and revenue to the water system and will be secured by both liens and a deed of trust on the property.
3. Agreements – There are no agreements at this time; however, any agreements received after delivery of this packet will be submitted prior to the Board’s meeting.
- e. Personnel Changes – See ***enclosed*** update of recent personnel changes as prepared by the Director of Management Services.
 - f. Mandatory Direct Deposit for New Employees – Adoption of the ***enclosed*** policy to require all new full-time employees to use direct bank deposit of payroll is recommended. The county’s primary bank will be required to offer no-charge checking or serve as a pay station for any new employee who does not have a banking relationship. As an incentive for current employees, pay for those using direct deposit is being made a day earlier than check distribution. Direct deposit avoids handling paychecks and employees needing to pick-up and cash checks during work hours.
 - g. \$4-for-Life Endorsement – Adoption of a resolution of support for the \$4-for-Life program is recommended. ***Enclosed*** is a sample resolution. There are no proposed changes to the allocation formula. Funding will come from doubling the current \$2 of the annual state fee to register an automobile that goes to the special fund for emergency medical services.
 - h. Memorial Placement Policy – The Board of Supervisors requested a policy be proposed on memorial placement on county property, particularly the courthouse grounds. It is recommended any requests for memorial placement be reviewed by the Courthouses Exhibits Committee and a recommendation by the committee be made to the Board of Supervisors for final approval.
 - i. Scheduling Surplus Property Disposal Public Hearings – Hearings would be appropriate on three properties. A hearing is necessary before property can be sold or otherwise transferred. Since the reassessment is completing, the values placed on the properties by Wingate Appraisal Service should be current and provide a starting place if sale is desired. the properties are:
 - 1) Route 100 Right of Way on Cloyd’s Mountain – The Board has approved transfer of a portion of the old landfill property needed for the four-laning. The county attorney reminded us that a hearing is necessary first.

- 2) Route 1030, Bagging Plant Road – Pasture land that was surplus school property now has sewer available, as well as water. It could be used for residential or commercial. It is between the one million-gallon Public Service Authority water tank and the county garage, adjacent to the Orchard Hills Subdivision.
 - 3) Route 11, Lee Highway – The surplus school property just east of Mount Pleasant Subdivision is being transferred to the Board. It is zoned industrial and has water and sewer available.
- j. Use of Firing Range – ***Enclosed*** is a memo from Sheriff Davis advising of concerns he has regarding the use of the old landfill as a public firing range.

Land Acquisition/Disposition –

- ◆ ***Enclosed*** is a request from James Whited to acquire property for residential use from the New River Industrial Park site. Mr. Whited is an adjacent property owner. While his request may be compatible with the planned adjacent residential community, I suggest any action be delayed until the plans for the Heron's Nest community are final. I believe an appropriate response is that the existing agreement with Mr. Boyer precludes any action at this time.
