Legal Matters

Dick Price Ford Unauthorized Water Usage – Mr. Price visited the PSA office this week protesting the bill of approximately \$16,000 that was issued for unauthorized water use over the past 20 years. The county attorney may want to advise the PSA Chairman and/or Board members on dealing with this protest, since the matter has also been referred to the Commonwealth Attorney for criminal enforcement.

Claytor Lake State Park Golden Anniversary – Discussion is recommended of an appropriate funding mechanism to assist with the celebration, but not to deter contributions from businesses and other governments that benefit from the park's presence. Supervisor Cook will have information regarding an appropriate role for the county.

Prospective Industry

Paper Recycling Plant – The state has requested a site plan be prepared in advance of the late April expected visit by the company. The state also has expressed concern regarding allowing housing development adjacent to the site. The preferred site is at the New River Industrial Park in the cleared area adjacent to the NRB plant, where a community ballfield is currently located.

New River Industrial Park Golf and Housing Development – Supervisor Cook has met with the developers and can explain a proposal to equally share the drainage expense of between \$300,000 and \$500,000.

T. Marzetti – An update will be provided regarding T. Marzetti's visit this week.
