

At a reconvened meeting of the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors held in joint session with the town councils of Dublin and Pulaski on Thursday, April 30, 1998, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Supervisors Meeting Room in the County Administration Building, 143 Third Street, NW, Suite 1 in the Town of Pulaski, the following were in attendance:

Vice-Chairman White welcomed those in attendance and opened the meeting.

RE: COUNTY-WIDE CLEANUP

An update on the county-wide cleanup plan for Saturdays May 2 & 16 was provided.

RE: SOLID WASTE LARGE ITEM DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING CENTER LOCATIONS

Supervisor Cook in his capacity as a New River Resource Authority board member noted of hopes to consolidate the recycling drop centers. Expected locations are the existing large item drop center on Dora Highway in the Town of Pulaski and the County Garage, just outside the Town of Dublin. The third site to serve the Fairlawn area, either in the east end of the county, the City of Radford or Montgomery County is also being proposed.

RE: CLAYTOR LAKE STATE PARK GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

Supervisor Cook in his capacity as a member of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration Committee reviewed the anniversary activities and encouraged full participation by all local governments.

RE: DRAPER MOUNTAIN OVERLOOK RESTORATION

Mayor Johnston reported that the Town Public Works department has commenced repair work at the overlook. The stone walls have been prepared. The schedule for the remainder of the renovation work, with the exception of paving, is for completion by July.

## OTHER MATTERS

Mayor Johnston also complimented the county on its Industrial Shell Building being listed in the Virginia Economic Development Partnership quarterly newsletter.

Mayor Keister reported that the former water storage tank at the Dublin Town Center, which was used by Burlington Industries, but has become an eyesore, is being taken down.

Councilman Skeens reported on the recreation study, noting that an explanation of the various levels of support for youth recreation had been clarified. He noted the study committee would plan to meet again prior to the summer and encouraged all local governments to provide suggestions on how best to work together for meeting the recreation needs of youth in the county.
