- a. Key Activity Timetable – Enclosed for the Board's review is an updated timetable.
- b. Update on Pulaski County Lifesaving Crew Concerns - This matter has been referred to the Regional Emergency Medical Services, Inc. (REMSI). I am advised it was the consensus of the REMSI Board of Directors members present at the May 2 REMSI meeting that any difficulty encountered by members of the Pulaski County Life Saving Crew be routed to the appropriate staff committee for resolution (Human Resources/ Station Leader/ Equipment and Facilities). It would be helpful if these problems would be submitted in writing, however, they can be delivered verbally at the regularly scheduled meetings. Should the appropriate staff committee feel that it is not within their span of control to resolve the problem, the concern will be routed to the REMSI Board of Directors. Additionally, it was requested that, Dr. David Stanley, REMSI Board member representing the County of Pulaski and David Smith, Executive Director, be notified whenever any item(s) related to emergency medical services are placed on the Board of Supervisors agenda.
- c. Appointments:
  1. New River Community Services Board – At the last regular meeting, the Board requested we invited Mr. Lewis Pratt and Dr. Nathan Tuck to consider serving. Mr. Pratt has declined to accept the Board's invitation. We have not heard from Dr. Tuck at this time. It has also been suggested Ms. Joan Knode and Mr. Bill Hubble be considered for future vacancies.
  2. Pulaski Encouraging Progress Committees – Mr. Bruce Cunningham has resigned from the committee. He has recommended Mr. Bill Cunningham be considered for appointment.

3. New River Community Action – The term of Mr. Jim Wallis expires June 30, 2000. He is eligible for reappointment.
4. New River Community College – The terms of Tom McCarthy & and Charles Tickle expire June 30, 2000. They are eligible for reappointment.
5. NR Highlands Resource Cons. Council – The term of Mr. Walter Paulson expires June 30, 2000. He is eligible for reappointment.

about issues or specific proposals to be addressed by VACO in 2000. Chairman Sheffey, Supervisor Cook and I are active on the legislative committees. I have no specific items to recommend, except the authorization for BPOL levy within town limits, mentioned below. I suggest our roles be to monitor and stress positions favorable to the county that are emphasized during the committee process.

- g. Scheduling Public Hearing – Meals Tax Ordinance Amendment for Compliance with Statewide Uniformity - Scheduling of a public hearing at the June 26 meeting is requested. Enclosed is information provided by Commissioner of Revenue Sayers explaining this request.
- h. Virginia Dept. of Health Grant Funding - The Virginia Department of Health is soliciting applications for loans and possible grants for water service to areas currently experiencing water quality problems. Mr. Huber is requesting the assistance of local sanitarians in determining areas meeting qualifications. A workshop regarding the application procedure was held on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Application deadline is June 14<sup>th</sup> which is prior to the next Board meeting. Thus, authorization is requested to apply for projects as may be appropriate. Updates will be provided via the weekly memo.
- i. Tool Allowance Modification to Meet IRS Requirements- The enclosed policy is recommended to accommodate federal income taxation of the employee tool allowance. Adding to salary will allow a more even income tax deduction than under the current practice of paying the tool allowance quarterly. Our auditors advise the allowance must be reported as income to the employee. Some adjustment of the allowance may be needed to accommodate for the allowance being taxed. The allowance was tax exempt in the past.
- j. Downtown Pulaski, Inc. Building Usage Request – The enclosed building usage application has been received from Downtown Pulaski, Inc. requesting use of the courthouse lawn on Main Street on the first and third Fridays of the months of June, July and August. Approval by the Board is recommended. Approval is also requested of county sponsorship of one of the concerts.
- k. Addition to Panel of Physicians – It is recommended Pulaski Community Hospital be added to the county's panel of physicians for workers compensation injury response. The hospital is now offering this service as not a part of the emergency room and offer discounts for radiology and laboratory services. See enclosed brochure explaining the services offered.
- l. Garbage Put Out Standards – See enclosed request from Mr. Ed Hoggatt. It is recommended this matter be referred to PSA staff for review. The PSA staff is considering a pilot "super can" program that would address some of the concerns of Mr. Hoggatt.
- m. BPOL Authorization in Towns – Support of legislation to allow county BPOI taxation in towns at county option is requested.

A closed meeting is requested pursuant to Section 2.1-344.A.1.3.5.7 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, to discuss personnel, legal, land acquisition/disposition, and prospective industry matters. Enclosed is a draft resolution to enter the closed meeting on recommended matters, as follows:

Land Acquisition –

Restaurant Recruitment – An update on the site development cost near exit 98 of I-81 is expected. The IDA was briefed at its last meeting on the possibility of needed financing assistance with the siting. The IDA membership was receptive. Enclosed are two e-mails with additional information.

Legal Matters –

Randolph Park – Enclosed is a description and cost estimate for a plaque for the park, as I understand supervisors have requested. The county attorney advised the park deed would not allow location of a sheriff's office without a deed modification.

Fairview Home – Supervisor Conner advises the Fairview Home Board has agreed to an audit of the home, but with the firm of Weaver and Morris of Dublin performing the audit. The firm has agreed to not charge the home for an audit.

Local Choice Adverse Experience Adjustment – See enclosed correspondence indicating Local Choice has not processed the appeal of the \$291,041 adverse experience charge.
