Personnel:

County Administration – I hope to have an update on my employment plans. I am also assembling data from other governmental agencies as to compensation of positions comparable to our key personnel.

Constitutional Officers – Enclosed is a request from the Commissioner of the Revenue. I support the request, except the amount requested may be too modest. Similar support is recommended for the Treasurer. Support is recommended based on the numerous optional services these offices undertake for the county.

Prospective Business:

Commercial Center – See enclosed correspondence from Barnett Properties, Inc. indicating the proposed impact on utilities and potential tax

base for a shopping center with a grocery store anchor for the Dublin area. Authorization is requested to prepare a feasibility study on the water and sewer extension to serve the area.
