SUBJECT: Public Hearings

- a. A request from Michael Boyer, to vacate a 15 ft. alley adjoining the eastern boundary of Walter's Mobile Home Court identified as tax map parcel 055-015-0000-0008 zoned R1, and adjoining the western boundaries of Sunny View Heights Lots 1 and 24 identified as tax map parcel 055-006-000A-0001 and 055-006-000A-0024 in the Massie District – A neighborhood meeting was held on this request to discuss any concerns of adjacent property owners. The community appeared to be in agreement with the request based on the conditions Mr. Boyer placed on himself detailed below and depicted on the enclosed plat. This plat vacation is being requested to complement a Special Use Permit for a Mitigation Plan for Walter's Mobile Home Court reviewed simultaneously and approved by the Commission. It is recommended the request be granted based on the following conditions:
- Confirmation by the County Attorney of receipt of an acceptable legal instrument to:
    1. Prohibit development of a new entrance serving Walters Mobile Home Park using the unimproved 40 ft. right of way within Sunny View Heights;
    2. Prohibit the placement of single wide homes on lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 24, 25, 26, 27, and 28 of Sunny View Heights; and
    3. Prohibit the placement of any principal structure on lots 1 and 24, however, the existing structure on lots 1 and 2 may remain, but may not be enlarged on the northwesterly side.
- b. Revisions to the Pulaski County Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map – The Commission received comments from three persons and plans to respond to concerns raised at their Tuesday, July 18<sup>th</sup> work session. The Commission is likely to submit a modified map as well as the narrative description at the August or September Board meetings. Since a hearing was advertised, comments on the proposed future land use map should be heard by the Board and referred back to the Commission at their August meeting.

SUBJECT: Highway Matters

b. Randolph Park Directional Signs - Assistance from VDOT is requested in placing directional signs on:

- ◆ Route 11, Lee Highway, approaching the intersection with Route 643, Cougar Trail Road;
- ◆ Route 611, approaching the intersection with Route 643, Cougar Trail Road;
- ◆ Route 100, Cleburne Boulevard, approaching the intersection with Route 683, Alexander Road; and
- ◆ Route 643, Cougar Trail Road approaching the intersection with Route 683, Alexander Road.

The directional signs would alert the public to the Randolph Park location. Advice is needed as to whether signs either specifically designating Randolph Park or a more generic park description can be located at appropriate locations on state right of way. Is it possible to erect signs similar to the industrial park and high school directional signs erected by VDOT? Ideally, may we use the Randolph Park logo on the directional signs?

- c. Request for Paving – Rt. 792, Davis Hollow Road – Ms. Rhonda Hinley of 4600 Davis Hollow Road has requested the road be paved.
- d. Resolution on Harry DeHaven Park Road Right-of-Way – The resident engineer may have a resolution format to recommend.
- e. Flooding on Dunkard's Bottom – During the recent heavy rains, flooding occurred along Route 661, Dunkard's Bottom Road. Residents requested a review of the storm water drainage area.
- f. Edgewood Drive Rural Addition Resolution – A proposed resolution to give final approval to this rural addition will be provided to the Board's. Mr. Crigger reports all needed easements are in hand to the satisfaction of the VDOT staff.
- g. Resolution for Doral Drive – Enclosed is a resolution describing the establishment and construction of Doral Drive .
- h. VDOT Primary Road Priorities – Delegate Keister has asked for the support of the Board of Supervisors in addressing road funding priorities (particularly Route 100 & Route 114). SUBJECT: Reports from County Administrator and Staff

- a. Key Activity Timetable – Enclosed for the Board's review is an updated timetable.
- b. Animal Pound Study- See enclosed presentation. Appointment of a committee to steer the study is recommended.
- c. Proposal for a Trail & Bikeway Joining the City of Radford & Pulaski County – Mr. Morgan has deferred action on this study, due to other priorities. It is recommended an exploration meeting be held with Chairman Sheffey, the county attorney, a Norfolk Southern Railroad representative, a Radford City staff representative, a Pathways for Radford representative, and a county staff participant.
- d. Appointments:
  1. New River Community Services Board – Ms. Diana Nunley will be asked to serve.
  2. PEP Steering – Appointment of Pulaski Mayor Charles Stewart to the committee is requested. The mayors of Dublin and Pulaski are ex-officio vice-chairmen of PEP. Appointment of Dave Hillman, Customs Officer located at the New River Valley Airport, is also requested.
  3. Public Service Authority/Sewerage Authority – A vacancy exists due to the untimely death of Mr. Carlos Morris.
  4. Business Tax Advisory Committee – A committee to review the proposal to convert the merchant's capital tax to a business license tax is recommended. The committee should include retail and wholesale merchants, contractors, professionals, and financial service business representatives. The committee should include business representatives from within and outside the towns. The Commissioner of the Revenue and the Treasurer are suggested as ex-

officio members of the committee. The committee should be asked to make a recommendation by October.

5. Code Enforcement Advisory Committee – Staff recommends establishment of an advisory committee for the planning and general code enforcement functions. The following persons are suggested in addition to the Building Appeals Board: Bob Henegar, Jeff Worrell, Mike Tilley, Neal Wirt, Bill Aden or a representative, Ken Anderson or a representative, Michael Gay, Jimmy Hurst, Allen Audas, Roger Lucas, and Don Rainey. Semi-annual meetings are recommended for the purpose of reviewing our procedures and providing comparisons with how matters are handled in other localities.

- f. Pulaski County Vacant Jail Disposition & Sheriff's Office Capacity/Reuse Study – See enclosed study. Approval is requested of the study recommendation to engage architectural services and seek a demolition permit from the Town of Pulaski Architectural Review Committee for the old jail.

This procedure was used on the addition to the County Youth Center/Central Gym.

The ordinance will codify the Economic Stimulus Program, which has been used to assist major industry expansion. Adopting the ordinance was part of the incentives offered for the current Volvo plant expansion. Funding for the ordinance is included in the current county budget. Authorization to advertise a public hearing at the August supervisors meeting on the ordinance adoption is requested.
- i. Scheduling Public Hearing August – Carryover Appropriations – An August hearing is recommended to receive a report on needed carry-over appropriations for FY 01.
