Happy 20th Anniversary, Randolph Park

On June 30, 2001, the grand opening of Randolph Park was held. The late Ms. Evelyn Alexander graciously donated the ninety-eight (98) acres of land to the County of Pulaski as an outdoor park for all to enjoy.

Current Assistant County Administrator, Mr. Anthony Akers, served on the Randolph Park Steering and Planning Commission and in 2001, was Randolph Park's manager. He vividly remembered Ms. Alexander telling him her vision for Randolph Park. She explained that she had an apparition one day while sitting alongside her pet mule near the pond area that served as a watering hole for her father's livestock. At that time, the Lord had spoken to her and allowed her to audibly hear children laughing and water splashing. It was then, she determined, that one day the property would be a place where children would have fun, laugh and learn how to swim. She also told Mr. Akers she wanted individuals of all ages to enjoy the property through various kinds of recreational and leisure activities.

Ms. Evelyn Alexander was not just a visionary; she put those visions into action. The primary benefactress of Randolph Park saw a need for recreational opportunities and acted on her vision. She offered practical advice on how Pulaski County's newest recreational project would provide individuals with opportunities to hike trails and swim in a state-of-the -art pool complex, that would make Pulaski County the envy of many localities. Pulaski County received a windfall when a once "working farm" was transformed into a first-class recreational facility. Over a three year period and through the efforts of county officials and citizen volunteers, her vision for the park quickly blossomed. It was named in honor of her parents, the late Randolph H. Alexander and Annie Crowgey Alexander, and was Ms. Alexander's way to preserve the land which supported her father's sheep, cattle and crops. Mr. Akers recalled when the steering committee decided to name the pool area, "The Evelyn Alexander Water Park", which was against Ms. Alexander's wishes. While she conceded to the name, Mr. Akers remembered the day Ms. Alexander and her lifelong friend, Ms. Francis Farmer, came to park shortly after her name had been placed on the building. Ms. Farmer said' "Look there Evelyn, look at your name". Mr. Akers recalled Ms. Alexander kept her head down the entire time and said, "I saw it already when we drove in".

Over the past 20 years, the vision Ms. Evelyn Alexander had as a girl has impacted the lives of thousands of people. Each summer, hundreds of kids enroll in the Randolph Park summer camp where they learn how swim and enjoy many fun activities and multitudes of our youth work as camp counselors, lifeguards and pool attendants. Thousands have enjoyed the shelters, walking trails, ball fields, disc golf course and courts and of course, the water park. With continuing renovations to Randolph Park, the next 20 years will prove to be above and beyond what we all can imagine and we are so very grateful for the generosity and vision of Ms. Evelyn Alexander. Evelyn set the course of Pulaski County's growth and lived by the scripture, "Where there is no VISION, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18)!

Pulaski County ACCE

Students enrolled in the Pulaski County ACCE (Access to Community College Education) Program attended a Community Service Fair in May to sign up for community service opportunities at non-profit organizations in Pulaski County. ACCE students are required to give back to Pulaski County through 80 hours of non-profit service for the years they are in the program. Some of the locations students will be working this summer include Randolph Park, Friends of Claytor Lake, Volunteer Fire Departments, and the YMCA. Last summer, ACCE students completed over 3,800 hours of service in Pulaski County.



Commissioner of the Revenue Office Updates

- Are you a Veteran listed as service-connected, permanent and totally disabled? Provide a copy of your disability letter from the U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs and complete our application so we can determine if you qualify for the "Motor Vehicle Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans". If qualified, only one vehicle may be exempted starting this year. For more details contact our Personal Property Department at (540) 980-7750.
- ♦ Historically, vehicle values tend to depreciate from month to month but the market effects from COVID-19 altered the anticipated trends. As a result, all major vehicle valuation services such as the National Automobile Dealers Association, indicate increased market values on vehicles due to supply and demand. Our office uniformly uses the NADA "Clean Trade-in value" when assigning values. If your mileage was over 100,000 miles as of January 2021, contact us at (540) 980-7750 so we can determine if the NADA guide allows for a high mileage reduction. Documented proof of high mileage must be provided.
- ♦ Pulaski County and the Virginia Constitution now allow for the exemption of certain real estate owned by surviving spouses of individuals killed in the line of duty. Contact our Real Estate Department at (540) 980-7753 for more information.
- Did you know? The primary role of the Commissioner of the Revenue Office is to implement tax laws created by the Virginia General Assembly as well as tax policies established by the local Board of Supervisors. Tax assessments conducted each year are based on these laws and policies.

Bike and hike the New River Trail.


