Building Official – Salary Range \$43,220 – \$70,664. Responsible for administration and enforcement of the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Pulaski County. Performs plan review and inspections on many construction types including residential, commercial, industrial, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing, as well as other duties. Supervises a Building Inspector and is an integral member of the Community Development Department. Candidate is required to be a licensed professional engineer or architect, building, fire or trade inspector, contractor, housing inspector or superintendent of fire or trade construction with at least five (5) years of experience. A Bachelor's degree is preferred. Must have a valid driver's license in Virginia. Must be certified by DHCD within 12 months of hire as a Certified Building Official. Preferred applicant will have DHCD certifications as a Certified Building Official and have experience in building and construction.
